<u>New daily development challenges:</u>



 Read/watch the story Dear Zoo (Youtube link below): What does an author do? Who is the publisher of the book? What was your favourite part of the story? What animal would you like from the zoo? 	Can you retell the story of 'dear zoo' to a grown up or your pet. You can be creative and choose your own animals to send back to the zoo. Show us your amazing story telling skills on dojo. Dear Zoo Rod Campbell	Draw/paint a picture of your favourite animal. With the help of an adult can you label the body parts on the animal (eyes, nose, ears, arms and legs).
Using foil or paper can you make some shapes. You could try making a triangle, square, rectangle, circle. How many corners/sides does your shape have? Are all the sides the same? You could even go on a walk with a grown up around the house and spot the shapes. Challenge: See what other shapes you can make.	Let's get fit and learn the names of lots of different animals. Using the Youtube link below can you flap your arms like an eagle or swing your arms like a monkey. Follow the video and have a go at the animal dance exercises.	Find some objects that have similar sounds to the animals in the book e.g. spoon, lego, mug, glass. Put these objects in the box and match the sounds of the objects to the initial sounds of the animal e.g. spoon could be used for sssss snake.



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Using a paper plate or even a piece of paper can you make a mask of an animal of your choice. We have attached some mask templates that you could also print off and use. What colour hair does your animal have? Does it have sharp teeth? Don't forget to add the eyes, ears and mouth on! Show us a picture of you wearing the masks and we will guess who is behind them.



Using the letter writing template can you write a letter with a grown up to the zoo asking if they could send you your favourite animal in the post? Where would you put the address on the letter? Why have you chosen that animal? Describe the animal in the letter. Don't forget to sign the letter at the end with your name so they know who to send the animal for.

Send your letters in on dojo so we can see your fantastic writing. Make a junk model animal using recycled materials from home. Send us your creations on dojo!
