We hope that you are all well and that you have enjoyed the home learning tasks especially the snail and the whale, which is one of my favourites. Thank you to everyone who has



Hide 6 - 10 objects on a tray. Look at the items for a minute before covering them with a towel. Remove one item and see if you can guess which item is missing. Repeat.

Can you put your socks on by yourself?



















Read / Watch Harry and his. bucketful of dinosaurs.
