Design your own pirate treasure map. Hide some 'treasure' in the garden or living room and give your map to help one of your family members find it!







The pirate has gold coins in 4 piles. He can move one or more coins at a time. How can he make all the piles the same










The word Pirate begins with the letter P. How many words can you think of that also begin with the letter P? Write these down and check your spellings!
