




















## Lakeside EYFS and KSI Home Learning






Attached are the suggested activities. Many of the activities can be adapted and done simply in a notebook, on paper or outside! Remember to look on the school website for the accompanying resources.

Teach pirates how to share their treasure fairly! Divide by 2! You could use real coins or objects from around the house!









Pirates aren't always very kind to each other - write down some 'top tips' to help them get along.











