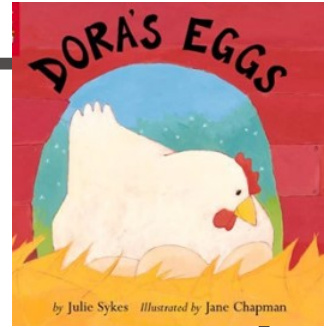
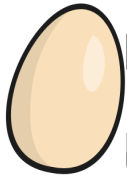


Lakeside Nursery Home Learning

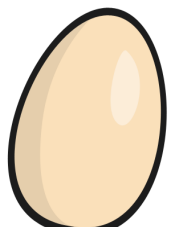
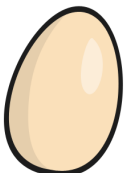
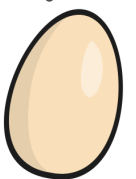
We hope that all of our families are well and have had a warm, well and safe weekend. We wanted to provide you with some more fun and educational home learning activities you could try with your child this week. again.

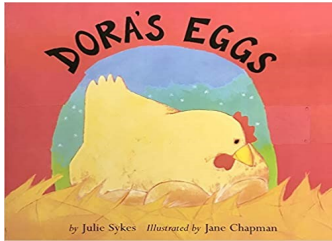

 "Dora's Eggs" by Julie Sykes.

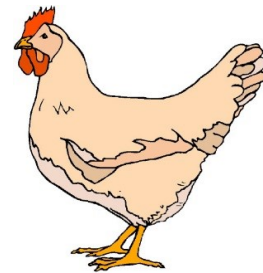

Who is the author and the illustrator? What do you think the book is about? Where is the blurb (on the back)? What does it say about the book?

Can you remember the names of the animals in the story? What are the names of the baby animals? Can you make their sounds and sing "Old Macdonald had a farm?" Have you drawn farm animals or played the farm number matching game (or make your own) from the school website?

Research -Lifecycles. Have a look at the lifecycle mats attached about frogs, butterflies and plants. Talk about them with your child. (Refer to week one and growing plants) Can you draw and label the lifecycle of the chicken from the egg?



Can you find shapes in your home? Count how many you find and make a list in words or pictures or both. Can you draw the objects you see and label the shapes?

Make a beautiful picture of a chick?

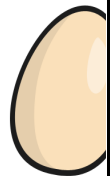
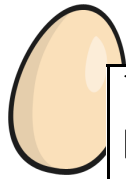
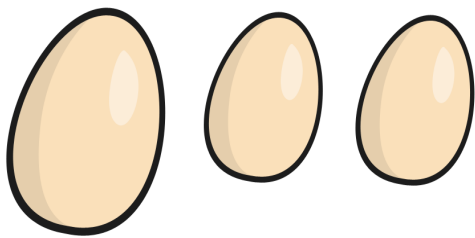


Can you paint a chicken or cut out or draw hand shapes and circles?

Talk about how proud Dora is of her eggs at the end of the story. Write or draw a picture of something you are proud of each day. E.g. got dressed independently, tidied up, helped with the washing, learnt something new;

Design-Can you make a chick yourself? Or another animal from the story?



Can you draw some pictures from the story and use these to help you to retell the story with your grown-ps?
