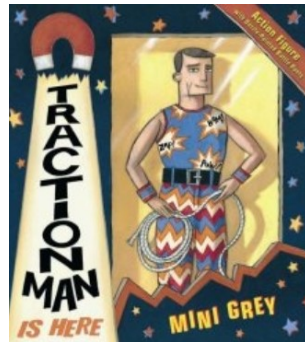


Lakeside EYFS and KSI Home Learning

Magnetic Superhero Scene


Science Experiments

Method

1. Begin by showing the children the superhero and some Tels. Talk about the superpowers of Tels.
2. Ask the children to carefully stick a paperclip on to the back of the superhero, using the sticky tape!
3. Show the children how to place a magnet behind the scene and the superhero in front of the scene.
4. Encourage the children to move the magnet along the back of the scene, to make the superhero move across the scene and 'fly' from one side to the other.
5. Children can make their own superhero scene in cards, upwards, downwards, and backwards, by moving the magnet in different ways. They could also draw their own pictures and scenes and make a longer scene for the superhero to 'fly' through.

You will need:

- Magnet
- Thin paperclip
- Sticky tape
- Superhero and Scene (downloaded)

Superhero Stick Puppet



You will need:

- Colly stick
- Light coloured card
- Coloured card/paper
- Scissors
- White glue



Instructions

1. First, draw and colour a triangle-shaped card onto red card and use your scissors to cut it out. This needs to be slightly shorter than the length of your colly stick.
2. Next, draw a face shape onto red card for your stick puppet, colour the face and hair and use your scissors to cut it out.
