


Lakeside EYFS and KSI Home Learning

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
Read and watch The Queen's Hat by Steve Antony

Design a brand new hat for the Queen. Make it as special and creative as you can.




Using creative resources, make your own very special party hat or crown.

Can you recognise, sort and order different coins?

Create a shop in your house. Use real money to practise buying and selling different items for different prices. Practise adding up the coins and giving change.



Solve some money addition problems. Look at some real coins and notes to help.



Order coins by value from the smallest amount to highest amount.



Build a big red bus or black taxi out of junk modelling resources.



Create a coin rubbing picture.



There are lots of bridges in London that go across the River Themes. Can you build a bridge out of different resources that's strong enough to hold an egg?
