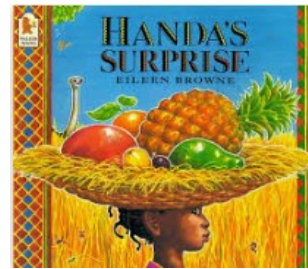


Lakeside EYFS and KSI Home Learning

Attached are the suggested activities. Many of the activities can be adapted and done simply in a notebook, on paper or outside.

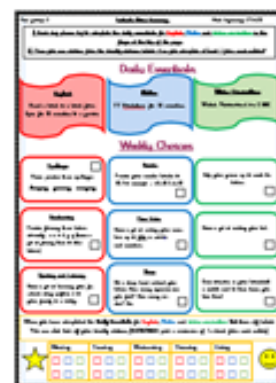
Please also keep reading regularly with your child and using the EPIC reading book app so you can access loads of books.

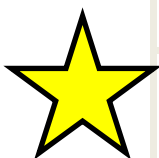

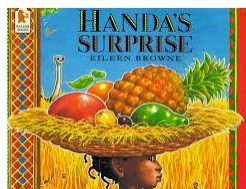

Link it to different fruits.

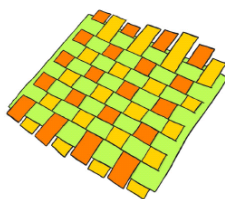
2 or more players:

Weave your own basket.

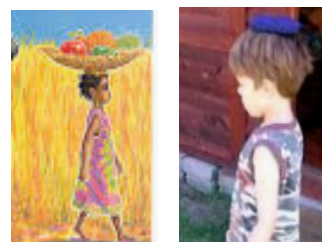

Balance an object on your head for 1 minute:

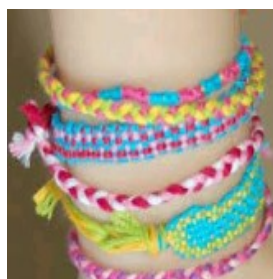
E.g. Use a bean bag or a cushion



Complete the friendship word search.



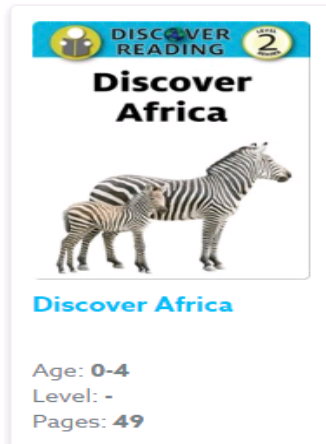
Make a friendship bracelet. You could make it out of strips of paper or wool.



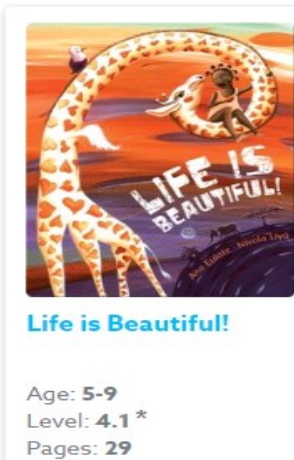
Write a letter or postcard to your friend about what you have been doing and how much you miss them. Then post or send it to them. Decorate it with your own pictures and stickers.

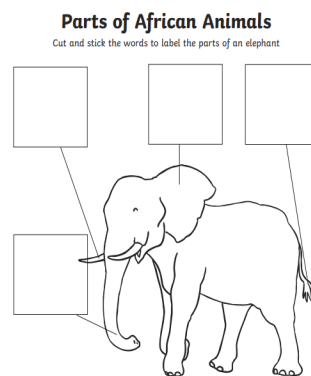
